No. 4 eBay Motors/Children's Tumor Foundation/Racing4 Research Porsche GT3 Team Ready To Roll And Raise Funding

A cautious yet productive run through Friday's rainy final practice session for this weekend's 50th Anniversary Rolex 24 At Daytona left the No. 4 eBay Motors/Children's Tumor Foundation/Racing4Research Porsche GT3 team ready to race and raise funds for the fight against neurofibromatosis (NF) in Saturday' day-long race.

Team drivers Ryan Eversley, Justin Bell, Daniel Graeff and Ron Yarab all had ample time at the wheel. "We went out Friday morning just to try the car," Bell said. "We had an error issue that we wanted to clarify on the data. It wasn't much fun, I can assure you, in the slippery conditions. After Thursday night's practice, we're very confident in the pace of our car. We're

going to rely heavily on the yellow flags, full course yellows and the wave-bys to gain position. This race will be down to the last yellow flag until the finish."

Eversley drove the opening laps in the wet session.

"We needed to bed in some brakes so went out, did the brakes, and while we were doing it, the car felt really good in the wet conditions," Eversley said. "So we worked on just kind of getting a lap out of it, and I think we were in the top 10 pretty easily. I ran around with Wolf Henzler for about a lap and a half and on our in laps we both had 52.1s or something. I'm pretty sure he wanted to stay out and go P1 as well but it was nice to have the car in the top 10 and not kill ourselves to do it. The focus was to get the car ready for the race."

GAINSCO Says No To Rain But Yes To Fans

A light but persistent band of rain showers kept more GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series teams in the garage than on the track Friday at Daytona International Speedway (DIS), and the new No. 99 GAINSCO Auto Insurance Corvette Daytona Prototype was among them.

"We feel really good," Alex Gurney said. "We were definitely hoping to get a last little run there today but the weather decided against it. We'll take the gamble. I don't know what we're going to do on setup but we feel pretty good about it. We were only going to make a small change. The car has been reliable. We feel pretty good, we think we're prepared across the board. The team has done a great job. We really focused on reliability, and I think that's going to be key for the race."

Gurney, who qualified the No. 99 fourth quickest with a lap time of 1:41.519 (126.242 mph) on Thursday, will start the race. The schedule calls for Gidley to drive second and Fogarty to fill the final spot in the rotation. All three drivers spent some time at the track Friday visiting with agent partners and employees from GAINSCO Auto Insurance.

"It's nice," Gidley said. "It's always nice when you have people behind you that are rooting you on or cheering you on, especially having an actively involved sponsor where people come out, see the car and the name. That's neat, it's for sure better to have fans than not to have fans. When they are your own personal GAINSCO fans, that makes it that much better."

Fogarty has been part of the GAINSCO/Bob Stallings Racing family since 2006.

"I am so incredibly fortunate and blessed to be a part of the GAINSCO/Bob Stallings Racing team," Fogarty said. "It is a dream to have a sponsor that is so committed and enthusiastic about a racing program. VISITFLORIDA.com Named Presenting Sponsor Of Inaugural North American Endurance Championship

VISITFLORIDA.com has been named the presenting sponsor of the inaugural North American Endurance Championship, a special competition encompassing major GRAND-AM Rolex Sports Car Series races at three of the continent's iconic race tracks: Daytona International Speedway, Watkins Glen International and Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

The North American Endurance Championship presented by VISITFLORIDA.com begins with this weekend's Rolex 24 At Daytona, followed by the Sahlen's Six Hours of The Glen on July 1 and the Super Weekend at the Brickyard at Indianapolis Motor Speedway on July 27.

To determine the championship winners in both the Rolex Series' Daytona Prototype and GT classes, points will be awarded on a 5-4-3-2 basis for drivers and teams. First place earns five points, with four for second, three for third and two for fourth and each following position.

The three events will each be scored uniquely, enabling drivers and teams to earn a possible maximum of 20 points at each. For the Rolex 24 At Daytona, points will be awarded based on standings in each class at six hours, 12 hours, 18 hours and the finish. At Watkins Glen International, points will be awarded at the three-hour mark and finish, with points multiplied by two. At Indianapolis, points will be awarded at the finish of the three-hour race, which will be multiplied by four.

The endurance championship winners will be crowned on the Victory Podium at Indianapolis Motor Speedway, following the historic GRAND-AM debut on the 2.605-mile road course. The DP champion team will receive \$100,000, with the GT champion team getting \$50,000.

"This inaugural championship is an exciting new addition to the Rolex Series season and now we have a great presenting sponsor partner to support it as well," said GRAND-AM CEO Ed Bennett. "Champions will no doubt cherish the moment when they are presented their trophies, at a legendary setting – Indianapolis.

The World's Fastest Neurosurgeon Is Back At Daytona

Dr. Jim Lowe - the World's Fastest Neurosurgeon - has returned to Daytona International Speedway to make his 7th appearance in the Grand-Am Rolex 24 at Daytona this weekend, January 28-29, 2012. This legendary twice around the clock event has held special meaning for Dr. Lowe since his first running in the Grand Touring class with The Racers Group in 2006. The following year Dr. Lowe and the newly formed team JLowe Racing placed third in GT class running the 64 JLowe Racing Porsche.

What started as a "pie-in-the-sky" dream quickly became an obsession. "It started out as a "maybe, someday, if everything were wonderful, maybe I would get to go once", recalls Dr. Lowe. "As I look back to the first 24 hour, it's hard to understand how it all happened. It has now become an obsession. Being here is absolutely my goal for how I want to spend my Januarys for as long as I can."

This weekend, Dr. Lowe will participate in the 50th Anniversary Rolex 24 at Daytona behind the wheel of the 77 Doran Racing Circle K Combos Ford Dallara Prototype with Brian and Burt Frisselle and IndyCar legend Paul Tracy.

Damon Barnett Passes

Damon Barnett, a member of the Road Racing Drivers Club (RRDC) passed away on December 26th. Barnett was the original Mazda motorsport Manger in the U.S. and he grew the program from early days of the RX-2 to the 1980's GTU domination of the RX-7.

Barnett was a native of Seattle and he was one of the first employees of Mazda North America starting in 1970. Between 1977 and and his transfer in 1989, he brough Mazda more than 29 manufacturers championships in IMSA and SCCA competition.
